SAN JOSE CALIFORNIA

This Silicon Valley city is not just a tech hub, it's also a vibrant place to play.

he San Jose area is known for being home to some of the world's biggest Internet and tech companies—including Google, Apple, Facebook and Intel. As the capital of Silicon Valley, San Jose is one of the wealthiest cities in the United States and the largest in the San Francsico Bay region. However, its appeal extends beyond technology, with fine food and wine, scenic mountain hikes, and a young, multicultural population bringing international energy to both work and play.

3 DAYS IN

DAY 1

Morning Fuel up for the day with a breakfast burrito at downtown's Cafe Rosalena. Then, tour a few of the tech giants: explore Apple's headquarters via augmented reality at the new Apple Park Visitor Center (1) in Cupertino, or take selfies in the colourful Android sculpture garden at Googleplex.

Afternoon Back downtown, swing by Good Karma Artisan Ales & Cafe for tasty vegan food and craft beer on tap. Then head to Santana Row, San Jose's chic outdoor shopping destination with hip brands such as Marine Layer and Warby Parker. If shopping isn't your thing, tour Winchester Mystery House across the street. This haunted mansion inspired the recent Hollywood film Winchester, starring Helen Mirren. **Evening** Dine at Michelinstarred Adega restaurant, a contemporary Portuguese hotspot run by a husbandand-wife team who met while working together in Lisbon. Seafood is a highlight on the menu, with options ranging from local abalone to deep-sea Carabineros (prawns) from Spain.





DAY 2

Morning Journey 45 minutes outside San Jose to enjoy Pacific Ocean views and to hike under giant redwoods at Big Basin Redwoods State Park (2). Then, on your way back, stop in the town of Los Gatos for a croissant and monkey bread at famed Manresa Bread. Afternoon Tour the caves and cellars at Testarossa Winery before enjoying a wine and cheese pairing. From there, visit Ridge Vineyards, the largest wine

Mountains. You'll need an appointment to try its famed Monte Bello Cabernet. **Evening** Stop in Saratoga for dinner at Plumed Horse. Its new chocolate shop across the street often sells out, but the restaurant's chocolate trolley offers a sampling if you still have room after a decadent, tasting-menu meal, which can include dishes such as local black cod or a black pepper and parmesan soufflé.

Rosewood Sand Hill

The Rosewood Sand Hill, located in nearby Menlo Park, has a serene vibe and great vistas—opt for a suite with views of the Santa Cruz Mountains, where the region's best vineyards are located. Book a treatment at Sense Spa, followed by a meal at Michelinstarred Madera. (rosewoodhotels.com)

The AC Hotel San Jose Downtown is a central option located within walking distance of the SAP Center, a concert venue and home arena for the NHL's San Jose Sharks. Raging Waters (3) as you shoot water cannons at its Pirate's Cove or plummet down a free-fall waterslide. After, watch daredevils show-off on their boards at Lake Cunningham Regional Skate Park, California's largest skatepark.

Evening Pick up a platter of tacos at Tacomania on the

way to West Wind Capitol Drive-In movie theatre to catch a new release. The retro drive-in is a favourite among locals on summer nights, and a nostalgic counterpoint to the modern digital age that San Jose helped create.
