Guests on The Mark hotel-managed tour enjoy spiced chicken samosas and other canapés by Jean-Georges, along with sunset views from the 70-footer. Included is full food and beverage service, plus transportation to and from The Mark. SEAFOOD AND ROSÉ...ALL DAY!



Underneath NoHo favorite Saxon + Parole, there's a new American *izakaya* (a type of informal Japanese pub) by AvroKO Hospitality Group—one focused on seafood paired with rosé. The Poni Room takes a pan-Asian approach to its menu of seafood-forward dishes, including uni muffins, coconut laksa with crab, and scallop skewers with sweet chili sauce. Sesame soy-braised lotus root, crispy pork belly, and salt-crusted whole dorade with lettuce wraps are a few other standouts by chefs Nicole Gajadhar and Brad Farmerie. Venture into the beverage room and choose from one of 20 different rosés by the glass, fish pitcher, bottle, or tap, along with boozy slushies, bottled cocktails, and seasonal beers. **316 Bowery, theponiroom.com**



TWA Hotel, the only on-site accommodation at JFK Airport, opened on May 15—its centerpiece is the restored 1962 former TWA terminal designed by Eero Saarinen (seen here) and a Lockheed Constellation L-1649A Starliner that was restored and transported 300 miles to become its bar. The 512-room facility features Knoll furnishings and Old Hollywood-inspired interiors, and "from the moment visitors arrive, they will find themselves immersed in the ethos of 1962's culture, architecture, sights, sounds and ambiance," said Tyler Morse, CEO of MCR and MORSE Development, the developer and lead investor of the project. **twahotel.com**

LADY LIBERTY LEARNING

The newly opened Statue of Liberty Museum on Liberty Island honors the history, influence, and legacy of the colossal 1886 sculpture, designed by Frédéric Auguste Bartholdi (metal framework built by Gustave Eiffel) and since 1984 a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The 26,000-square-foot interactive museum features three gallery spaces, and its rooftop is planted with native meadow grasses, offering visitors sweeping skyline views of lower Manhattan and all of New York Harbor. It's all part of a \$100 million Liberty Island-wide beautification effort led by campaign chairperson Diane von Furstenberg. Museum access, including audio tours, is free with the purchase of a ferry ticket to Liberty and Ellis Islands. **statueoflibertymuseum.org**
