



A BRIGHTER BRUNCH

Forget the buffets; brunching in Las Vegas just got a whole lot sexier, and even more decadent (if that's possible). Mott 32, the contemporary Cantonese restaurant from Hong Kong, is now serving a bottomless dim sum Sunday brunch that includes all-you-can-eat signature dishes like barbecue Pluma Ibérico pork with scrambled eggs and freshly shaved black truffle. The options are practically endless, from fried mashed potatoes with beef short rib and king prawn har gow with garlic chive to South Australian scallop, garoupa, and egg white dumplings, all paired with free-flowing beverages including champagne and cocktails.
