



CARRIE'S NEW KITCHEN

Carrie Nahabedian is one of Chicago's most decorated chefs, holding a Michelin star for her restaurant NAHA since the city's first guide was published in 2010, and winning a James Beard Foundation Award in 2008 for Best Chef, Great Lakes. She closed NAHA last spring, but diners can still find her French fine dining down the street at Brindille. Fans will be even more happy to note that she's opening a second River North restaurant in October at The Gwen, a Luxury Collection Hotel attached to Shops at North Bridge. KOHLER'S FIRST CHI-TOWN SPA

Kohler, Wisconsin has long been a golf and spa getaway for Windy City residents, and its Kohler Water Spa has become a hydrotherapy mecca. Now, Kohler Water Spa Lincoln Park brings this resort experience to the city with a 20,000-square-foot urban spa and 21 treatment rooms. Along with a sauna, steam room, and plunge pool, the hydrotherapy circuit includes a large-scale hydromassage experience and a whirlpool accented by blue mosaic tiles and a gooseneck waterfall. Hydrating body wraps, cupping, and CBD massages are just a few of the specialty treatments to choose from. THE WONDER OF WARHOL

The Art Institute of Chicago launches the first U.S. retrospective in 20 years of pop art's most revered figure with *Andy Warhol: From A to B and Back Again*, which runs from October 20 through January 26. With new materials and scholarship to draw from, the exhibition reveals new complexities about one of the most influential and important American artists. More than 300 works will be featured—from soup cans to album covers—spanning Warhol's career from beginnings as a commercial illustrator in the 1950s to his iconic pop art of the early 1960s to experimental work in film and ready-made abstraction. **111 South Michigan Avenue, artic.edu**



ADVENTURES IN BUILDING

The largest exhibition of contemporary architecture and related art in North America returns with the Chicago Architecture Biennial. In its third edition, this multi-faceted exploration runs from September 19 through January 5. All exhibits and programs are free and open to the public—together producing an international forum on architecture and urbanism.
